November brought pleasant weather and joyful energy across our campus.

Children actively took part in the Sports Meet game selections with great enthusiasm.

The highlight of the month was Children's Day, celebrated with fun and excitement. We sincerely thank all parents for their continued support and encouragement throughout these events.

# CIRCLE TIME

Pre KG Children shared their feelings, listened to others, and found ways to make friends happy. They played simple games, took turns, and spoke about their favourite foods and animals. These activities helped them learn kindness, sharing, problem-solving, and building friendships while working together in small group tasks

LKG Children discussed rules for different times of the day, ways to solve problems, and how to keep the classroom clean. They shared materials, ideas, and space while drawing vehicles, building stories, and playing with friends.

UKG Children greeted friends with actions, made friendship bands, and discussed what it means to be a good friend. They shared ways to help and cheer others, solved simple water-use problems, explored reusing water, and talked about caring, empathy, and staying safe during bad weather.

Every Thursday during Circle Time, teachers read stories to KG children to build listening skills and develop a love for reading.




# THEME TIME

Pre KG Children explored pets, farm animals, jungle animals, and creatures around us, including water and sea animals. They enjoyed simple animal riddles and learned about the food we eat, understanding food from plants and animals, and identifying healthy and unhealthy foods through fun, hands-on activities.


LKG Children identified land vehicles and their uses, named their parts, and enacted simple safety rules. They sang action songs, pretended to be airplanes, and explored vehicles Toto can use. They also learned about water transport, solved vehicle puzzles, and compared different water vehicles through engaging visual activities.

Children circled and discussed food items, identified healthy foods, and even checked their lunch boxes to spot healthy choices. They explored water sources, transparency, mixing, and sink-or-float activities. They also learned about rainy, sunny, and windy weather, observing how different things move with the wind.

# ENGLISH TIME



Pre KG Children enjoyed singing the rhyme *Omni Octopus is Sick*, tracing the letters Oo, Qq, Rr, Ss, and Tt in sand and air. They listened to stories like *Quincy Queen* and *Sammy Sparrow*, played a treasure hunt game, and named words beginning with T, strengthening early literacy skills.

LKG Children related to the feelings of story characters and practiced stretching words while writing letters Yy, Zz, and Xx. They sequenced events in stories like *Air Transport*, listened for words starting with Qq, read and wrote labels during a class tour, and learned to sequence three events in a story.

UKG Children practiced naming pictures beginning with the ch- and sh-sounds and matched picture cards with word cards. They listened to stories like *The Picnic Box* and others with the th and long ow sounds, answered questions, played pick-and-describe games, used describing words, and enjoyed a bingo game with words of the same meaning.

# MATH TIME

Pre KG Children rolled dice to say numbers, matched objects without counting, and sang poems while guessing fish numbers. They practiced numbers 1-10, identified missing parts in pictures, compared big and small animals, explored light and heavy objects, performed take-away activities up to 5, and identified, showed, and traced the number 6.

LKG Children compared tall and short objects and practiced numbers 8, 9, and 10 by naming, showing, tracing, and writing them. They counted beads, made towers with 9 blocks, traced numbers in the air and on cards, identified the tallest tower, counted 10 blocks, and wrote the number 10.

UKG Children practiced saying number names on cards and played number-name games. They grouped healthy and unhealthy foods, arranged potatoes by size, used counters to write numbers 1-50, and explored capacity by filling mugs. They also counted and added blocks, objects in circles, and ice-cream sticks to develop early math skills.

During play time, Pre KG children engaged in fun physical activities to develop coordination and gross motor skills. They said numbers on dice while hopping, kicked balls, walked on planks, jumped from benches and over ropes, and danced like birds and water animals, enjoying active movement and creative expression.

LKG Children practiced running, stopping quickly, and making turns. They passed and kicked balls, balanced on one foot, jumped with both feet, caught balls, and walked like horses. These activities enhanced their coordination, balance, and gross motor skills while encouraging fun and active movement.

UKG Children enjoyed various movement activities during play time. They walked along straight and curved lines, jumped and spun, ran races, and danced to music. These fun exercises helped develop balance, coordination, spatial awareness, and gross motor skills while promoting active participation and joyful physical expression.

**During Art Time, Pre KG children explored creativity through hands-on activities. They tore paper to make butterflies, painted using colour drops, filled glasses with water using spoons, shaped clay, sorted beans into bowls, and built various creations with blocks. These activities enhanced fine motor skills, coordination, and imaginative expression.**

**LKG Children practiced fine motor skills by holding pencils with a tripod grip, tearing and pasting paper, and cutting along curved lines. They poured water from one glass to another and created paper fans. These activities enhanced hand-eye coordination, precision, and creativity while strengthening small muscle movements.**

**UKG Children practiced essential life skills by using zippers and buttons, opening lunch boxes independently, and making greeting cards. These activities enhanced their self-help abilities, fine motor skills, creativity, and confidence, encouraging independence and practical skills for daily routines in a fun and engaging way.**

On 6th November, children celebrated Colour Dress Day, dressing up in a colour of their choice. This fun activity encouraged self-expression, creativity, and confidence. **UKG C and LKG A presented an assembly on the topics of Seasons and Punctuality.**



# Annual Sports Day KG to GRADE 4











# Reminders / Request
