

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Dear Parents,


Greetings from Nawis!


Nawis joyfully welcomed our kindergartners back to school. Our little learners returned on August 31st with excitement and enthusiasm to begin a new learning journey.

At Nawis, we believe learning is a lifelong adventure. Together — school, home, and community — we strive to nurture confident, creative, and compassionate young minds.



# Circle Time





Pre Kg children learned about feelings and shared their experiences in helping others. They listened to a storybook about kindness, played "Rover, Rover," and helped friends make puppets. They also learned rules for marking attendance, going outside the classroom, and practiced taking turns while playing games.



LKG children learned to follow class rules and routines. They shared ideas on how to take care of themselves and how to work together in a group. They also learned to share resources and cooperate with friends during activities and playtime.

UKG children shared what they ate for breakfast and discussed ideas to stay healthy. They played a fun game guessing friends' names with eyes closed and completed pictures in groups. They talked about pets, shared ways to solve problems, and worked together to achieve common goals.






# Science Time




Pre-KG children listened to a story and answered questions with excitement. They pretended to be doctors and named objects from picture cards and mystery bags. They identified colors and objects, pasted black strips on a zebra outline, searched for orange, green, and brown things, and enjoyed mixing colors for handprints.




Education is not the learning of **FACTS**, but the training of the mind to **THINK**.

LKG children learned about water and land animals, and explored different kinds of birds and their features. They built nests using grass and paper cuttings, discovered various animal homes, and matched animals to their correct homes through fun and engaging activities.



UKG children learned about simple tools by drawing lines with and without a ruler and wrapping a box. They matched community helpers with their tools, learned about pet animals and their homes, sorted farm and wild animals through fun activities.






# English Time




Pre-KG children sang songs and danced joyfully. They found names beginning with the letter H, listened to a story while pointing at pictures, and arranged storyboards. They practiced making slanting lines on trays and in sand, and clapped for letters starting with J while tracing them.




LKG children practiced drawing predictions and explored letters Oo and Uu. They looked at pictures and answered questions, and learned letters Ll, Bb, and Jj, recognizing and writing them confidently.

UKG children recited rhymes and answered questions. They learned -og family words, -od, -op, -ot, and -ox family words. They looked at pictures to identify the beginning, middle, and end sounds, and practiced making words with the -ug family.


# Math Time



Pre Kg children enjoyed hands-on activities to learn numbers and concepts. They did actions to show number 1, rolled the action dice and repeated actions twice, and wrote number 2 in the air. They explored positional words like in, out, on, and under, and did actions for number 3.

Lkg Children compared water levels in glasses to understand quantity, traced number 3, named and counted objects up to 4. They recognized, repeated, and extended simple patterns using colors and shapes. They also traced and wrote number 5 confidently, strengthening their fine motor and number recognition skills.


UKG children drew objects to match given numbers and made bundles to represent numbers from 15 to 20. They practiced writing missing numbers that come before and after, represented the number 17 using beads, and used a number line to identify numbers that come before, after, and in between 1 to 20.





# Play Time

Happy times

During Play Time activities, Pre-KG children walked on a beam, jumped off a low step, and crawled through a box with excitement. They enjoyed copying their partner's actions, walked carefully on a straight line, and collected balls by crossing a bridge, enhancing their balance, coordination, and gross motor skills.

LKG children caught large plastic balls, threw them high above their heads, and kicked balls towards a target with control. They practiced walking forward, backward, fast, and slow, acted like birds with joy, and strung small beads, improving coordination, balance, and fine motor skills.



UKG children caught balls with confidence, made letter formations using their bodies, and walked forward and backward on a zigzag beam. They also hopped forward and popped bubble wrap with excitement, enhancing their coordination, balance, and gross motor control through fun and engaging activities.





# Art Time



During Fine Motor activities, Pre-KG children played with different shapes, rolled, beat, and patted clay to build hand strength, and transferred beads using a tripod grip. They also made tall towers and created colorful necklaces, developing their creativity, coordination, and fine motor control through hands-on play.

LKG children practiced wrist and finger movements to improve grip, ran around the circle with enthusiasm, and folded napkins in quarters and papers in half. They painted using brushes and enacted daily routines, enhancing coordination, creativity, and self-help skills through engaging tasks.



UKG children coloured sheets using sleeping lines and created animal masks. These activities enhanced their fine motor skills, hand-eye coordination, and creativity, while allowing them to express ideas and enjoy hands-on art experiences.

Blue Day was celebrated on 5th September. Children came dressed in beautiful blue attire, showcasing the colour of calmness and harmony. A special assembly was conducted, and children enjoyed colouring various blue objects, making the day joyful and helping them learn about the significance of the colour blue.

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
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# Reminders/ Request
