# Circle Time

Our Pre KG Children practiced personal hygiene, learned to dress on their own, and expressed emotions with ease. They shared joyful moments with friends and showed empathy in small ways. Every day was a step forward in building life skills with love and laughter.

Our Lkg Children practiced sharing, taking turns, and expressing their feelings. They explored teamwork by building towers with blocks and solved small social problems with gentle guidance. Each day, they blossomed with confidence, kindness, and curiosity, making beautiful memories in their learning journey.

Our Ukg children explored feelings and friendships through joyful activities. They took turns to create group stories, used stick puppets to express emotions, and shared how to act when feeling happy, sad, or angry. They also discussed teamwork and what makes a good neighbour—learning the beauty of working together.





# Science Time




Pre Kg children delved into understanding of cleanliness and organizing their surroundings. They explored where things belong and the importance of staying clean and tidy. Through fun dress-up activities, they identified clothes we wear daily and for special occasions, discovering different types of clothing based on weather, events, and culture.

Lkg children explored the life cycle of a butterfly by making butterfly eggs and arranging its life stages. They also learned about land animals, their features, and body parts through engaging games like "Guess Who I Am," enhancing their observation and vocabulary skills in fun and meaningful ways.

Ukg children listened to stories and identified places in their neighbourhood, strengthening their understanding of the world around them. They also explored community helpers, learning about different jobs people do and why each role is important. These activities helped children appreciate teamwork and the value of every job.



# Language Time



June was filled with fun letter adventures! Pre Kg Children enjoyed picture stories like Freddy Frog Makes a Friend and Gilly the Goat, clapping for words beginning with F and G. They traced the letters, drew sleeping and standing lines, and built early literacy skills through joyful listening and storytelling.

Lkg children strengthened their phonics skills by identifying beginning sounds in words and writing letters Rr, Mm, Dd, and Gg. Through engaging stories, clapping games, and tracing activities, they built sound-letter connections and practiced fine motor skills—laying a strong foundation for reading and early writing development.



Ukg children built early literacy by making i family words like -ig, -in, -it, and -ip. They explored opposites through fun games and used question cards to ask and answer "who," "what," "where," "why," and "when"—boosting vocabulary, thinking skills, and confidence in speaking and listening.





# Math Time



In June, Pre Kg children learned to tell the time of day by observing pictures and acted out daily activities. They created patterns with sun, moon, and star cutouts, compared object heights, measured classmates using hand spans, and arranged themselves from shortest to tallest—building early math and observation skills.

Lkg children sorted blocks, beads, and crayons by color and shape, and grouped same shapes together. They practiced writing numbers 1 and 2, identified and ordered objects by size, and enjoyed playful learning through hands-on activities that strengthened their math skills and creativity during playtime.

Ukg children learned to identify, represent, and write numbers 13 and 14. They made bundles of ice cream sticks, counted shapes in graphs, and grouped pencils in bundles of ten plus extras. They practiced addition and subtraction by putting together and taking away triangles, enhancing math confidence.



# Play Time

Pre Kg children enhanced their motor skills by walking on straight lines and moving carefully around obstacles. They practiced throwing balls with coordination and pedaled through paths, building balance, strength, and spatial awareness—all through fun, active play that supports healthy physical growth and confidence.

Lkg children practiced kicking balls at targets, rolling on the ground, and hopping forward and backward. These fun activities helped improve their coordination, balance, and strength, encouraging active play that supports their physical development and confidence in moving their bodies in different ways.

Ukg children enjoyed moving forward and backward on beams, playing hopping games and jumping over hurdles. These exciting activities enhanced their balance, coordination, and social skills, encouraging teamwork and confidence while having loads of fun through active play and friendly competition.







# Art Time

Pre Kg children practiced holding big crayons to draw confidently, strung large beads to enhance hand-eye coordination, folded paper in half to explore shapes, and created colorful patterns using pegs. These hands-on activities developed their fine motor skills, creativity, and concentration in a fun and engaging way.

Lkg children explored painting with large sweeping brush strokes, folded paper into square shapes, and practiced cutting along straight lines to develop fine motor control. They also learned to use eating utensils independently, building self-care skills and confidence through creative and practical activities.

Ukg children crafted beautiful paper flowers, and decorated their names by sticking colorful paper. They also learned to open jars with screw lids, developing fine motor skills, creativity, and independence through engaging, hands-on activities that build confidence and coordination.






## Reminder's /Request
