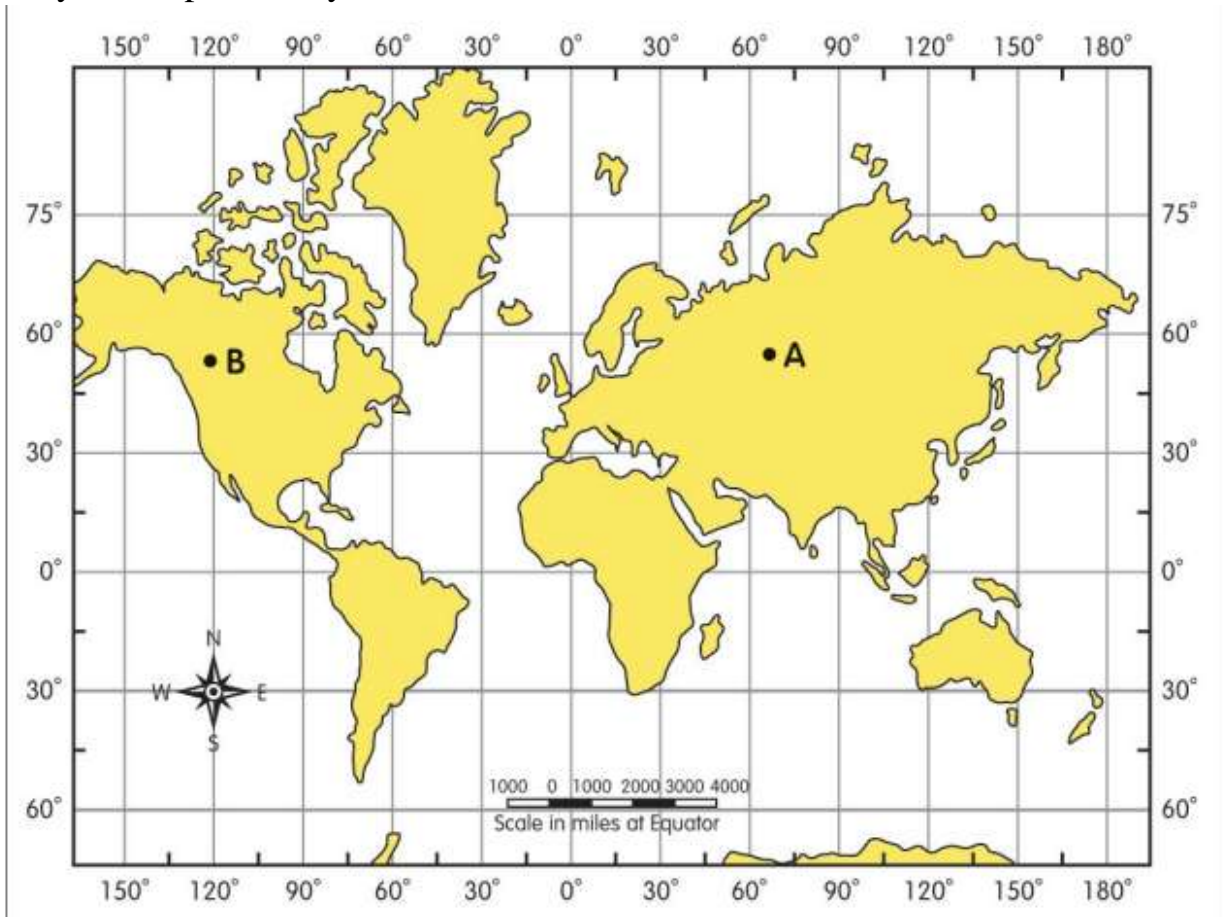
- 26.Read the conversation and answer the questions.

- (iv) What can be done to help farmers in such a helpless situation? Suggest one way.

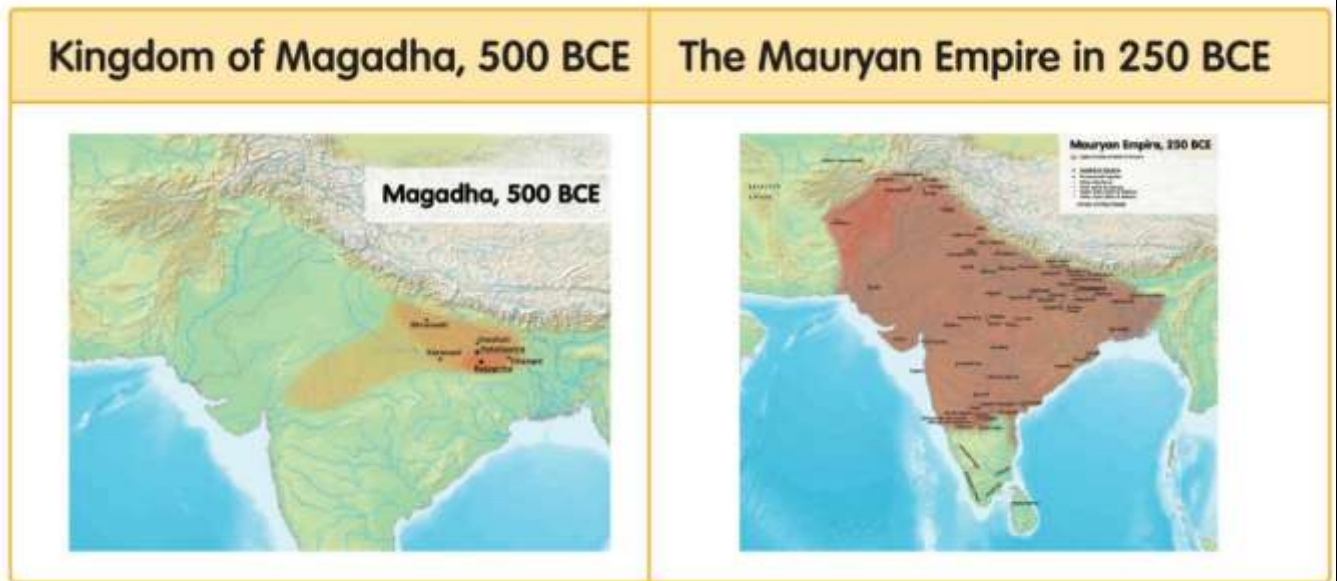
